

The Facts:

- In the U.S., Human Trafficking is a thriving industry.
- Each year more and more victims are being identified and rescued.
- There are not nearly enough specialized aftercare facilities to treat survivors.
- If a trafficking survivor does not receive adequate care, within 48-72 hours of his/her rescue they will likely fall back into exploitation and trafficking.

The Remedy: Hebron Hills

Hebron Hills, which is being built on 45 rural acres in southern Arkansas is slated to be a faith-based comprehensive care facility for survivors of human trafficking. The care received will include:

- Equine Therapy
- Education
